HCV Treatment Advocate Training

The HCV Treatment Advocate training is designed to increase the skills and competence of Peer Workers and harm reduction/NSP service providers to successfully implement and conduct a HCV Treatment Readiness Intervention at the NGO they currently work at.

The HCV Treatment Advocate training will be provided in a team format, peer worker and staff co-worker. Each HCV Treatment Advocate will acquire the skills to enable them to know how perform HCV rapid tests; provide risk reduction counseling; facilitate groups/educational workshops; conduct outreach and techniques on how to educate and support their peers, other staff members, and community members in order to improve prevention, treatment access, and personal well being living with HCV.

Upon completing the training each participant will be ready and capable to go back to they're representing NGO and start conducting peer based HCV treatment advocacy and treatment readiness/support interventions.

The eligibility criteria to attend this training is as follows:

- Each participating team must consist of a peer worker and a co-worker staff member, working in a harm reduction or NSP program;
- The NGO must agree to integrate and provide the HCV treatment readiness services upon completion of the training.

The training is free of charge, including hotel and travel costs. Peer workers who are working voluntarily (unpaid) at services, will receive a fee for their participation.
